There's a Difference Between Having an Opinion and Being Opinionated.

DEFINITION - Opinion

Noun: A belief or judgment that rests on grounds insufficient to produce complete certainty. A **personal view, attitude, or appraisal.**

DEFINITION - Opinionated

Adjective: **Obstinate or conceited** with regard to the merit of one's own opinions; **conceitedly dogmatic.**

<u>Unfriendly people</u> care only about themselves; they lash out at common sense. <u>Fools</u> have no interest in understanding; they only want to air their own opinions.

<u>Wise</u> words are like deep waters; wisdom flows from the wise like a bubbling brook.

How Should We Deal With Opinionated People?

1. Check Your Pride.

Only by pride cometh contention: but with the well advised is wisdom. **Proverbs 13:10 (KJV)**

2. Don't Waste Your Words.

Though good advice lies deep within the heart, a person with understanding will draw it out. **Proverbs 20:5 (NLT)**

3. Sometimes It's Worth It, Most of the Time It Isn't. If you punish a mocker, the <u>simpleminded</u> will learn a lesson; if you correct the wise, they will be all the wiser. **Proverbs 19:25 (NLT)**

Anyone who rebukes a mocker will get an insult in return. Anyone who corrects the wicked will get hurt. So don't bother correcting mockers; they will only hate you. But correct the wise, and they will love you.

4. We Can Only Control Ourselves

To acquire wisdom is to love yourself; people who cherish understanding will prosper. Sensible people control their temper; they earn respect by overlooking wrongs.
