Relational Vampires Loving Hypocritical People

Hypocrisy (dictionary): Imposing a standard on others that you yourself aren't living.

Hypocrite (greek noun hypokrités): A play actor.

Jesus didn't come to start a <u>religion</u>; He came to establish a <u>relationship</u>.

What did Jesus say about hypocrites?

1. Hypocrites don't extend grace.

They (hypocrites) crush people with unbearable religious demands and never lift a finger to ease the burden.

Matthew 23:4 (NLT)

2. Hypocrites desire to be noticed.

"But they (hypocrites) do their deeds to be noticed by men..." Matthew 23:5 (NIV)

3. Hypocrites distance others from God.

"Hypocrites! For you shut the door of the Kingdom of Heaven in people's faces. You won't go in yourselves, and you don't let others enter either." Matthew 23:13 (NLT)

4. Hypocrites devalue what's most valuable.

"Hypocrites! For you are careful to tithe even the tiniest income from your herb gardens, but you ignore the **more important** aspects of the law—justice, mercy, and faith." Matthew 23:23 (NLT)

What was Jesus' solution for hypocrisy?

25 "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! **You clean the outside** of the cup and dish, **but inside** they are full of greed and self-indulgence. 26 Blind

Pharisee! First clean the inside of the cup and dish, and then the outside also will be clean. Matthew 23:25-26 (NIV)

Jesus doesn't demand we "try harder" on the <u>outside</u>; He challenges us to "look closer" on the inside.

27 "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You are like whitewashed tombs, which look beautiful on the outside but on the inside are full of the bones of the dead and everything unclean. 28 In the same way, on the outside you appear to people as righteous but on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness. Matthew 23:25-28 (NIV)

Jesus loves the real you - not the pretend you.

But now God has shown us a way to be made right with Him without keeping the requirements of the law, as was promised in the writings of Moses and the prophets long ago. We are made right with God by placing our faith in Jesus Christ. And this is true for everyone who believes, no matter who we are. Romans 3:21-22 (NLT)
