She wrapped him snugly in **strips of cloth** and **laid him in a manger**, because there was **no lodging available** for them.

They were terrified, <sup>10</sup> but the angel reassured them. **"Don't be afraid!"** he said. "I bring you good news that will bring great joy to all people. <sup>11</sup> The Savior—yes, the Messiah, the Lord—has been born today in Bethlehem, the city of David! <sup>12</sup> And you will recognize him by this sign: You will find a baby wrapped snugly in strips of cloth, lying in a manger."
